1. Who is the Data controller? (responsible for Your personal data)

Conclusion, performance, and settlement of the contract	<p>If You are acting in the capacity of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a Contractor who is a sole proprietor – the legal basis for processing Your data is Article 6 sec. 1 letter b) GDPR* i.e., data processing is necessary for taking measures related to the conclusion and performance of the contract. • a person designated by the Contractor to perform the contract or to serve as a contact person for matters related to the performance of the contract, or a representative (including an authorized agent) of our Contractor (regardless of the legal form of the Contractor’s business)—the legal basis for processing Your data is Article 6 sec. 1 letter f) GDPR, i.e. AWP’s legitimate interest in facilitating communication with the Contractor and ensuring the proper performance and settlement of the contract.
Compliance with the legal obligations incurred by AWP, in particular tax, accounting, and administrative obligations	Article 6 sec. 1 letter c) GDPR i.e. fulfillment of the legal obligations incurred by the Data controller under applicable law, in particular tax law and the accounting act.
Analysis of the applicability of financial sanctions before and after establishing a business relationship – this requirement applies exclusively to the Contractor	Article 6 sec. 1 letter c) GDPR i.e. compliance with the legal obligations imposed on the Data controller under applicable law.
Identifying, pursuing and defending against claims, as well as ensuring accountability	Article 6 sec. 1 letter f) GDPR, i.e. our legitimate interest in being able to identify, pursue, and defend against potential claims, as well as in being able to demonstrate that we process Your data in accordance with the provisions of the GDPR.

Categories of data recipients</p> 	<p>We may disclose Your personal data to entities authorized by law and to entities acting as data processors on our behalf, such as other entities within the Allianz Group, providers of IT, postal, and document management services, entities providing financial and accounting services, technical consultants, and service technicians. In addition, we may transfer Your personal data in the event of a planned or actual reorganization, merger, sale, joint venture, assignment, disposal, or other disposition of all or part of our business or assets (including in the context of bankruptcy or similar proceedings).</p>
<p>4. Where is Your personal data processed?</p> 	<p>Your personal data may be processed both within and outside the European Economic Area (EEA), but always in accordance with contractual confidentiality and security restrictions, in accordance with applicable data protection regulations.</p> <p>Whenever we transfer Your personal data outside the EEA for processing by another Allianz Group entity, this is done on the basis of binding corporate rules approved by Allianz, known as the Allianz Binding Corporate Rules (BCR), which ensure an adequate level of personal data protection and are legally binding on all Allianz Group companies. The content of the BCR can be found at Binding Corporate Rules (allianz-partners.com).</p> <p>When the BCRs do not apply in a given case, we will take other appropriate measures to ensure that the transfer of Your personal data outside the EEA is carried out with a level of protection equivalent to that applicable within the EEA.</p> <p>Information about the safeguards used in connection with such data transfers (e.g., standard contractual clauses) can be obtained by contacting us as indicated in section 1 of this clause.</p>
<p>5. Data retention period</p> 	<p>We will retain Your personal data:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> for the purpose of entering into and performing the contract – until the contract is terminated or expires, to fulfill the legal obligations incumbent upon the Data controller, in particular tax, accounting, and administrative obligations – for the periods specified by applicable law, including provisions setting forth the retention periods for accounting records, <p>After the above purposes have been fulfilled, we may retain Your personal data for a period corresponding to the statute of limitations for any potential claims, only to the extent necessary to establish, pursue, or defend against claims and to ensure accountability - that is, the ability to demonstrate that we process Your data in accordance with the provisions of the GDPR.</p> <p>This period may be extended if the statute of limitations is interrupted or if proceedings are initiated before the competent authority or court - until such proceedings are finally concluded. <p>6. What are Your rights?</p> 	<p>To the extent permitted by applicable law, You have the right to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> access Your personal data; update or correct Your personal data so that it is always accurate; remove Your personal data if it is no longer needed for the purposes indicated above; request the restriction of the processing of Your personal data in certain circumstances, e.g., when You contest the accuracy of Your personal data; obtain Your personal data; object in accordance with section 7 of this clause; submit a complaint or claim to us or to the relevant data protection authority. In Poland, this authority is the President of the Personal Data Protection Office. <p>You can exercise these rights by contacting us in accordance with the detailed information provided in section 1 of this clause, providing Your name, email address, and the subject of Your request.</p>
<p>7. Objection to data processing</p> 	<p>To the extent permitted by applicable law, You have the right to object to our processing of Your personal data or to request that we cease processing it (including for direct marketing purposes). You may exercise this right in the same manner as the other rights set out in section 6 of this clause.</p>



<p>8. Safety</p> 	<p>We use appropriate technical and organizational safety measures to protect Your data against accidental or intentional manipulation, partial or total loss, destruction, or unauthorized access by third parties. Our safety measures are continuously improved in line with technological developments.</p>
<p>9. Data sources</p> 	<p>In principle, we obtain personal data directly from You.</p> <p>If You are a representative (including an authorized agent) of a Contractor or a person designated as a contact in connection with the conclusion, performance, or settlement of the contract, Your personal data may be obtained from the Contractor You represent or who has designated You as the contact person. This applies in particular to the following personal data: Your first and last name, work phone number, work email address, job title, and work address.</p>
<p>10. Information about automated decision-making, including profiling</p>	<p>The Data controller does not use Your data for automated decision-making, including profiling.</p>
<p>11. Obligation to provide data</p>	<p>Providing personal data is voluntary, but necessary to enable the conclusion and performance of the contract.</p>
